2024 SUNY Digital Learning Conference "Educating for Digital Citizenship"

The proposal process has been redesigned to encourage faculty and staff to connect beyond departmental and campus boundaries to pilot, share, and scale-up transformative teaching and learning practices connected to the Chancellor's strategic four pillar objectives and our shared commitment for leading sustainable, impactful innovations that return value by multiple measures. These competitive seed grant programs will also focus on how these program objectives can be supported by focusing on:

- (1) optimizing artificial intelligence (AI) for teaching and learning, and/or
- (2) expanding support for the adoption of open educational resources (OER).
