Instructional Design Certificate Program

This 18-week certification program focuses on equipping participants with skills in instructional design, assessment development, course evaluation, and the utilization of assessment data and feedback for continual course enhancement. The program also facilitates proficiency in conducting high-quality course reviews utilizing the OSQR rubric and acquiring communication skills essential for effective collaboration with faculty members.

There are 3 online asynchronous courses. The courses are 6 weeks in length each. A digital badge will be awarded for the completion of each course and the completion of the overall Certificate Program.




