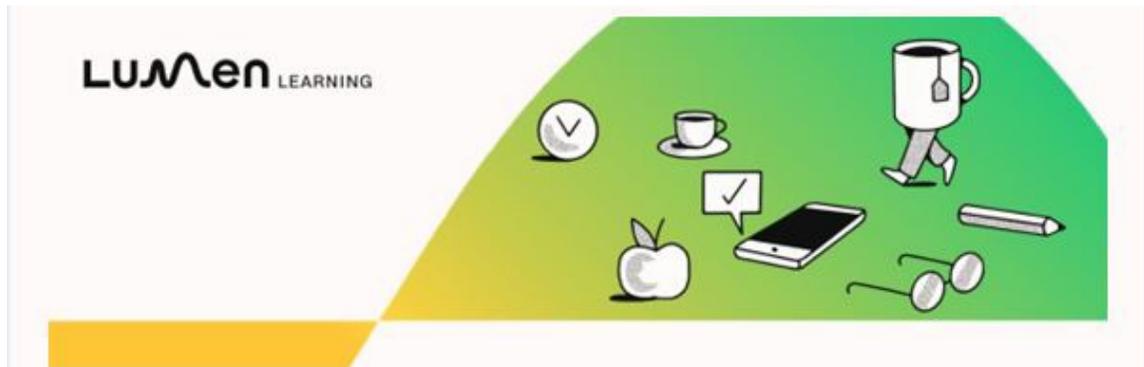

Summer Leadership Academy

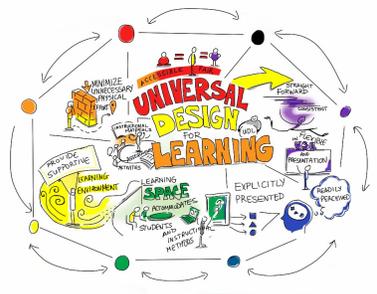

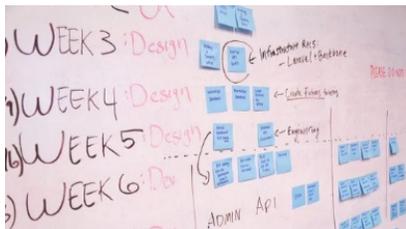
