Taking a course on Institutional Effectiveness or

Assessment Leadership equips higher education professionals with the skills needed to drive positive and impactful change within their institutions. By utilizing data-driven decision-making and fostering a culture of continuous improvement, participants can enhance accountability, transparency, and overall institutional performance, which in turn will strengthen institutions and provide the best possible learning environments for students. In short, its about maximizing the positive impact they can have.

Why do you like teaching this topic?

My tenure at the community college has provided me with firsthand insights into challenges such as accreditation, leadership transitions, and issues related to student enrollment and retention, as well as the necessity of developing robust programs to serve diverse student populations. I have successfully led multiple accreditation projects, and I have held various roles, such as division chair for technical academic programs and assessment committee chair for both functional areas and academic programs. I firmly believe in the value of professional development opportunities that allow educators to receive feedback, apply their experiences to theoretical frameworks, and explore promising practices supported by research and literature.

What have YOU learned from teaching this course?

To never stop learning! Through teaching these courses, I am constantly learning new things. Having a growth mindset is not only key to survival as a higher education professional, but I also feel that it is how we can imagine new possibilities and trends and collaborate to ensure that we develop innovative, resilient, and strong institutional cultures.

Fun fact to share?

Research collected over the years from NILOA and AA&U shows that institutions that actively engage in assessment and continuous improvement can achieve up to 30% higher student retention rates than those that do not. Imagine the profound impact a strong focus on assessment and IE has on student success!
